





Letter from the CCS Board President

Dear Friends.

These past several years have been filled with many important milestones during the tenure of our immediate past chair, Maria Palacio. Both CCS and our community owe her a debt of gratitude for leading Catholic Community Services out to the margins to include the most isolated among us.

In 2017, CCS launched the Cavazos Program for Latino Youth and Families. This program transformed the original Cavazos Center residential model to a new paradigm of providing community-based supports to strengthen Latino families. 2017 marked the official transfer of the Saint Joseph Shelter, Mission Benedict and Casa Adele programs in Mt. Angel from the Benedictine Sisters of Mount Angel to CCS. It is a great honor to work alongside the Benedictine Sisters to sustain these vital ministries.

We introduced our Community-Based Employment Services for adults with disabilities. We are now working to expand that program to serve youth aging out of foster care and young moms and families facing adversity.

CCS continues our efforts to encourage our community and policymakers to shift from a focus on disease, disability and dysfunction, to relationships, health, knowledge and self-sufficiency.

The CCS Board is implementing a new structure with two committees titled Ownership Linkage and Board Governance to get us closer to the voice of the people of Oregon and monitor the pursuit of our Futures Plan in providing benefits at sustainable costs.

Reggie's Story A Reason for Enhanced Support for Foster Parents

Reggie entered foster care when he was ten years old. He missed his siblings and his mom, and felt sad, empty and alone. These feelings followed him through several disrupted foster home placements.

Reggie finally found his Forever Home with Roy and Kim Moore, and they have been a family ever since. He speaks with emotion about feeling loved when he realized that he wouldn't be asked to leave and go to another home again after he got in trouble. Their patience, consistency, and even their strictness, showed him how much they cared and opened a whole new world and a level playing field for Reggie. Roy and Kim were his cheering section, cheering for him from the stands at high school football games all the way to his graduation from the University of Oregon. "They were there," says Reggie, plain and simple. "They were there."

In this role, they will provide support and advice to foster parents and respite to youth living in nearby foster homes. Studies show that safe, stable nurturing relationships are the most important factor in determining whether a child grows up to enjoy health, success in school and financial self-sufficiency as an adult. That is why CCS and many of our partners and donors have invested in Enhanced Support for Foster Parents. The new model will support a greater number of foster parents to provide stable, nurturing homes for children, with Central Home parents offering extended family support to help foster families be successful.

Friends.

We are truly grateful for the abundant gifts of time, talent and treasure that you, our donors, friends, staff and supporters have bestowed on Catholic Community Services Foundation. This support allows us to serve our most vulnerable neighbors by raising funds to provide them with concrete support in times of need; through advocacy for systems change, such as our current work with local partners to create a Strong Families, Vibrant Communities tax credit; and through partnerships to develop and maintain quality affordable housing properties.

In 2017, we were encouraged in our efforts with significant support from Oregon Housing and Community Services through their Local Innovation Fast Track (LIFT) program. Vanessa's Story

A Reason for St. Monica Apartments for Babies and Their Young Parents

Vanessa came to live in St. Brigid Home pregnant, alone and scared. Her traditional Cambodian parents felt so upset and disrespected by their 17-year old daughter who was pregnant out of wedlock, that they were unable to accept her in their home.

St. Brigid Home provided a safe, nurturing place for Vanessa to stay for the rest of her pregnancy. With the help of donors, the Father Taaffe Homes program was able to supply not only food and shelter, but also parenting skills training and planning for future self-sufficiency. Audrey and Tyler Hanke, the house parents, were there for Vanessa every step of the way, and Audrey helped her through birthing her healthy baby boy, Mylo. "I learned that I can actually be a good mom," said Vanessa. "They made me feel like I can raise a child."

Babies have a way of changing everything. Vanessa is now reunited with her family and they love Mylo. She is working, and she and Mylo live on their own. Her goal is to graduate college and continue to provide a safe home where Mylo will thrive.

Soon the Fr. Taaffe St. Monica Apartments will open its doors to the first babies with a young parent like Vanessa, providing safety and on-site support to help both moms and babies get a healthy start in life


As Robin grew older, so did her desire to find meaningful work in the community. She turned to Catholic Community Services' Employment Services program and found the support she was looking for in her Job Coach, Jordan. Together, Robin and Jordan explored Robin's talents and interests and talked about positions that would be a good fit for her.

One of Robin's passions is sports. She plays on several different sports teams throughout the season with Special Olympics. After honing her interview skills and developing her resume, Robin landed her dream job at the YMCA as a youth sports coach.

Robin settled into her part-time job with the Y and even found time for a second job in retail. Robin is a strong-willed, passionate, and hard-working individual whose abilities outshine the challenges she faces. "I would say to a 15 or 16 year old, don't let anyone tell you that you can't. Fostering Hope Initiative



FHI Breaking Through Barriers and Gaining New Ground

The Fostering Hope Initiative (FHI) continued to gain major support, break through barriers and improve outcomes in 2017.

The FHI Next Level Project was awarded \$200,000 by the Willamette Valley Community Health (WVCH) Transformation Program. The project will develop a prototype Health and Wellness Information System to address social service, housing and health needs of vulnerable individuals and families, and seek to significantly improve health outcomes and decrease health care costs in eight financially distressed local neighborhoods.

FHI's Certified Community Health Workers, who typically live in the neighborhoods they serve, integrate health care, housing and social services for residents who experience high rates of poverty, chronic disease, teen pregnancy and child maltreatment. They also teach and build Family Protective Factors, facilitate neighbor social connections, and offer parental skills training.

In September 2017, CCS and FHI broke ground on a new affordable housing complex in Woodburn.

Villa Esperanza will offer 16 apartments for low-income families. The name was chosen by neighbors and community partners and means "Hope Villa" - a reflection of the innovative design which addresses major barriers for families in crisis such as access to transportation and child care, as well as secure, stable housing. The complex includes a community room, spaces for direct services and training classes, and early learning activities.

Oregon Housing and Community Services is the major funder of Villa Esperanza through a Local Innovation and Fast Track Housing (LIFT) Grant of \$3,462,478. Funding partners include Community and Shelter Assistance (CASA) of Oregon, Carlson Veit Architects, and LMC Construction.



CCS began operating Rainbow Lodge near McMinnville, a residential treatment center for "delinguent and emotionally disturbed boys."



Catholic Community Services Foundation was created as a separate 501(c)3 not-forprofit organization to manage properties housing CCS programs and facilities and to raise sustaining funds.

CCS was instrumental in bringing Treatment Foster Care to Oregon and began offering the Independent Living Program to teach critical life skills to youth as they aged out of foster care.



CCS opened Work Options, a program providing supported employment for people with intellectual or developmental disabilities.





The first CCS Tokarski Community Home for Children opened in Keizer. Also known as Forever Homes, these homes provide children in long-term foster care with a home to call their own.



CCS opened Street Vision, now known as the Cavazos Program, serving Latino youth who have experienced adjudication.



CCS was nationally accredited by the Council on Accreditation, the nation's largest and most respected social services accrediting body. This commitment to best practices and delivery of quality, effective services continues with regular reviews.





Construction began on the Bishop Steiner Building, CCS headquarters on Portland Road in Northeast Salem, named in honor of Bishop Kenneth Steiner, Auxilary Bishop, Archdiocese of Portland.


